

Aslackby Parish Council

PARISH COUNCILLORS

Vacancies on the Aslackby Parish Council occur from time to time and are then advertised on the village notice board and on www.aslackbyvillage.org.

Subject to the number of responses, positions are filled by election or co-option at a meeting of the Parish Council. Parishioners may register an interest in the appointment at any time.

The statutory rules for Parish Councillors are below. Aslackby Parish Council seeks volunteers willing to give their time for free to attend Parish Council meetings and to work on behalf of their community.

Like all local councils, Aslackby Parish Council aims to represent the local community and to improve community wellbeing.

Candidates for co-option must:

- Be a British citizen, or a citizen of the Commonwealth or European Union
- Be 18 years or older on the day nominated for election
- For the whole of the 12 months prior to nomination:
 - Have been an elector of the parish and either rented or occupied premises in the parish, or
 - Resided within three miles of the boundary of the parish, or
 - Had principal or only place of work in that area.

Candidates for co-option must not:

- Have been subject to a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order

- Within five years of the day of election, have been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and having had a prison sentence (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine
- Work or have worked for the Parish Council
